# **Project Description and Details**

- 1. Is the program thoroughly conceived and planned? Does the project align with HTX's granting mission?
- 2. Are the activities clearly described and confirmed?
- 3. Is the choice of schedule, format, and facilities appropriate to the target audience?
- 4. Does the applicant clearly demonstrate the need for this project?
- 5. Does the project address multiple perspectives on the issue(s) at hand?
- 6. Can its approach be characterized as narrow or rigid?
- 7. Does the project promote any specific initiatives of HTx?
- 8. Does the project promote a particular political, religious, or ideological point of view, advocate for a particular program of social or political action, or support specific public policies or legislation?

- 3. The program makes effective use of institutional partnerships to achieve its stated goals.
- 4. The program will reach an underserved community in the state.
- 5. The organization is based in a county that Humanities Texas staff have deemed to be recently underserved by the grants program.
