Led by education professionals from the 9/11 Memorial & Museum, this interactive webinar will guide teachers in sparking critical thinking, empathy, and real-world connections while teaching 9/11 to a generation with no lived memory of the attacks. Participants will be taken on a virtual guided tour of the museum and will explore extensive online resources, including multimedia lesson plans and a robust archive of first-person stories.
