Teaching Film Adaptations

The webinar will explore the process of teaching film adaptations of literary texts in the secondary English language arts classroom. The presentation will cover some of the differences between teaching film and literature, as well as important terms and approaches in film analysis.

DONNA KORNHABER is University Distinguished Teaching Professor and Arthur J. Thaman & Wilhelmina Dore Thaman Endowed Professor in English at The University of Texas at Austin. She is the author of *Charlie Chaplin, Director* (Northwestern University Press, 2014), *Wes Anderson: A Collector's Cinema* (Contemporary Film Directors Series, University of Illinois Press, 2017), *Nightmares in the Dream Sanctuary: War and the Animated Film* (University of Chicago Press, 2019), and *Silent Film: A Very Short Introduction* (Very Short Introductions Series, Oxford University Press, 2020), and she is the series editor of the *21st Century Film Essentials* book series with The University of Texas Press. In 2016, Dr. Kornhaber was named an Academy Film Scholar by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences.
