RANDALL FULLER is the Herman Melville Distinguished Professor of Nineteenth Century American Literature at the University of Kansas. He is the author of *The Book that Changed America: How Darwin's Theory of Evolution Ignited the Nation* (Viking Press, 2017); *Emerson's Ghosts: Literature, Politics, and the Making of Americanists* (Oxford University Press 2007); and *From Battlefields Rising: How the Civil War Transformed American Literature* (Oxford University Press, 2011), which won the Phi Beta Kappa's Christian Gauss Award for best literary criticism. A book on women and transcendentalism, *Bright Circle*, is forthcoming from Oxford University Press. He has written for the *New York Times*, *Wall Street Journal*, *Humanities*, *American Literature*, and *American Literary History* and has received fellowships from the Guggenheim Foundation, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and the National Humanities Center.
